DISTRICT-WIDE PROGRAMS

The Edina Education Fund is proud to support the Edina Public Schools in its mission to educate all individuals to be responsible, lifelong learners who possess the skills, knowledge, creativity, sense of self-worth, and ethical values necessary to thrive in a rapidly changing, culturally diverse, global society. The following highlights many of the programs and grants made possible by the Edina Education Fund.

Personal Financial Literacy

Through generous donations, the Edina Ed Fund has worked closely with Edina High School to develop ongoing Personal Financial Literacy programs. This coursework introduces students to the connection between economics and human behavior and prepares them with valuable skills to successfully navigate their financial future.

World Savvy

In partnership with World Savvy and the Edina Ed Fund, the Edina Public Schools successfully launched its First Global Competence Certificate (GCC) Cohort. World Savvy, a national non-profit organization, offers global competence training and professional development programs to schools and educators across the globe. Developed by leading experts in the field of global competence education-- Teachers College at Columbia University, World Savvy, and Asia Society--the GCC program provides teachers the tools to educate students with real world skills to succeed in an interconnected and interdependent world. The nine teachers who participated in the program, represent all nine Edina Public Schools. They teach a variety of subjects from elementary school reading to high school calculus. These educators are now expected to impart their knowledge to other teachers across the district. Upon completion of the program, these teachers formally share their training with colleagues.

South View Writing Center

Over the past five years, the Edina Ed Fund has supported the South View Middle School Writing Center that serves as a model for other writing centers across the district. Peer-to-peer coaches help fellow classmates improve writing and communication skills, while developing their own leadership and critical thinking skills.

Project Lead The Way

Project Lead the Way is a STEM-focused curriculum offered nationwide in over 8,000 schools, including Edina Public Schools. This rigorous course of study teaches students the fundamentals of engineering through innovative, hands-on activities. Available to all 7th through 12th grade students, classes include both required and elective learning opportunities. During the past year, 640 Edina High School students enrolled in PLTW classes including: Principles of Engineering, Civil Engineering and Architecture, Digital Electronics, Aerospace Engineering, AP Computer Science, and Engineering Design and Development. Exposure to the wide breadth of STEM courses would not be available through the standard curriculum without additional funding from the Edina Ed Fund.





EDUCATOR GRANTS

In addition to district-wide programs, the Edina Education Fund administers an annual grant process evaluating and selecting from a wide range of applications. Teachers from all nine Edina Public Schools, who are seeking funds for programs that engage students through unique educational experiences are encouraged to apply. Grants typically range in size from \$1,000 to \$5,000 and are based on a number of factors including the number of students served and the quality of the proposed idea. Occasionally, the initial grants serve as seed money and lead to funding of broader district initiatives. Last year, the Edina Ed Fund awarded approximately \$55,000 in grants, including a one-time grant of \$20,000 in honor of our twentieth anniversary. Below are examples of some of the programs made possible through the partnership of Edina Public School teachers' ingenuity and Edina Ed Fund's funding.

Concord: MakerSpace Design Lab

The MakerSpace Design Lab at Concord Elementary School uses a wide variety of materials to encourage creative problem solving emphasizing and strengthening student collaboration, communication skills, and connections to real world issues. As a pilot initiative, the Edina Public School's learned from Concord's MakerSpace's successes and plans to expand similar age-appropriate educational spaces and experiences to all of the Edina schools.

Edina High School: Creating a Virtual Reality

To enhance the Aerospace Engineering course, an Edina Ed Fund grant helped the Project Lead the Way (PLTW) program purchase Virtual Reality equipment. Approximately 140 Edina High School students experienced flight simulation as part of this curriculum, augmenting their connection to the course material and deepening their knowledge of how theory meets reality.

South View Middle School: Collaborating with a Colombian Composer

Through an Edina Ed Fund grant, Victoriano Valencia, a Colombian composer, will be commissioning a piece of music specifically designed for the South View Middle School band. The grant funds this composition and also support for student interaction and discussion with the composer. Through these conversations, students will gain a greater appreciation for Colombian music and culture.



Countryside: Architecture Center



The Countryside Architecture Center provides opportunities for students to explore buildings and structures around the world and throughout history. This center encourages our students to become architects, building with various materials and learning first-hand the importance of trial and error.

Edina High School/Valley View Middle School: Professional Large Format Dye Sublimation Equipment

A grant from the Edina Ed Fund helped Project Lead the Way purchase equipment that transfers digital images to almost any material. Combining special paper, ink and heat, the process prints on approximately 1,500 different materials such as fabric, metal, and slate. Students' use the technology creatively to incorporate their ideas and concepts in ways previously unavailable. Once trained, students quickly understand how to operate the equipment and become experts.



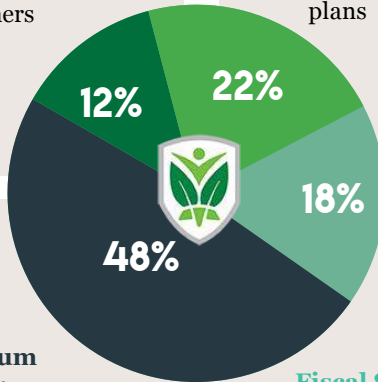
GET INVOLVED

Educator Grants: Ten grants totaling \$55,000 given to support creative teaching and learning impacting kindergartners through high school seniors

Scholarships: Over \$65,000 in scholarships to high school seniors to assist with their post-secondary education plans
